**TEACHER GUIDE for FAMILY & TRADITIONS**

**FAMILIES**

- A family is two or more people who are connected by biology, marriage, adoption, or a strong bond. Family members typically love and care for each other a lot.
- The family members that you live with are often referred to as your "immediate family" and your other family members who live elsewhere are your "extended family."
- Families can look very different from each other. Some families are made up of parents and children. There could be one parent or two parents and any number of children. Often the two parents are married. The children's grandparents, aunts, and uncles may be included in the family too. There might be nieces and nephews, who are the children's cousins.
- Some families are made up of adults who do not have any children.
- Sometimes families are made up of multiple parents if one or both parents re-marry. Then the children have step-parents and can also have step-siblings.
- Sometimes children are adopted into a family. Then they have an adoptive family and a biological family.
- Sometimes people make their own extended families with close friends or neighbors who they care for deeply.
- There is no right or wrong family, and all families are special in their own way.

**TRADITIONS**

A tradition is a special, fun thing that a family, community, or culture does over and over that is passed down through generations. Traditions create shared memories and a sense of belonging.

Traditions may just be within a family. Like eating a holiday in a certain way each year, pizza for dinner every Friday, or letting each member pick what's for dinner on their birthday.

Traditions can be started at anytime! They can be weekly, monthly, or annually. Traditions are shared by larger groups of people who have the same culture, religion, etc. Traditions can help people feel more connected to their cultures, communities, or families. Traditions are the customs, traditions, food, clothing, art, and way of living for a particular nation or group.

A tradition is a common way of doing things. It is called a tradition. It is something many people do and have done for many years. Usually, a tradition is shared by people from the same culture, religion, or community. An example of a tradition is how to celebrate a holiday. Another example is how people in certain cultures greet each other when greeting one another.
