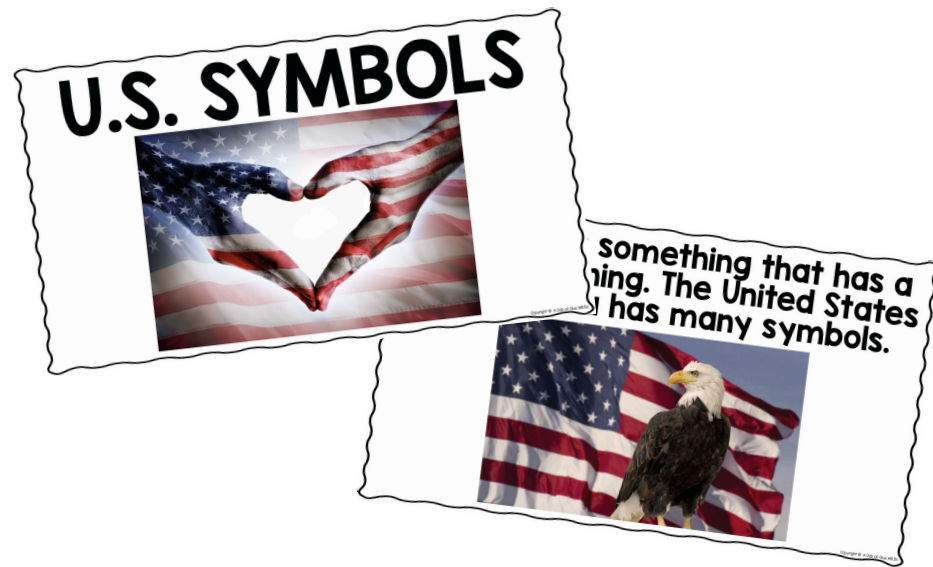
## American Flag

The American flag is red, white, and blue. It has 50 stars. The stars stand for the 50 states. It has 13 stripes. The stripes are red and white. The stripes stand for the first 13 colonies. The flag is called Old Glory. It is a U.S. symbol. The flag stands for freedom and pride. Look around! You can see the flag in many places.

**UNITED STATES SYMBOLS**

- A symbol is something that has a special meaning. The United States has many symbols that represent the country and what it stands for. Some symbols can be seen widely across the country, and some are located in a specific place.

**AMERICAN FLAG**

- The Flag of the United States of America is a symbol for Americans across the world. Many people recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag every day. The national anthem, written by Francis Scott Key, is about the flag.
- The Flag contains 13 stripes, 7 red and 6 white, to represent the 13 original colonies. There are white stars on a blue rectangle, one star for each state. The original flag, called Stars and Stripes, was sewn by Betsy Ross.
- There are certain rules to follow when displaying an American flag. It should be displayed from sunrise to sunset on buildings and outside on staffs. If the flag is left out overnight, it should be illuminated. When transporting the flag, it is to be done with care and respect.
- Flags should be displayed in classrooms, public institutions, polling places, and more. On certain remembrance days, days after certain deaths, and other tragedies, the flag is to be displayed at half-staff.
