- Her bravery helped change laws and shows how one person can make a difference.




BOOKER T. WASHINGTON

- He wanted everyone to have equal rights and respect.





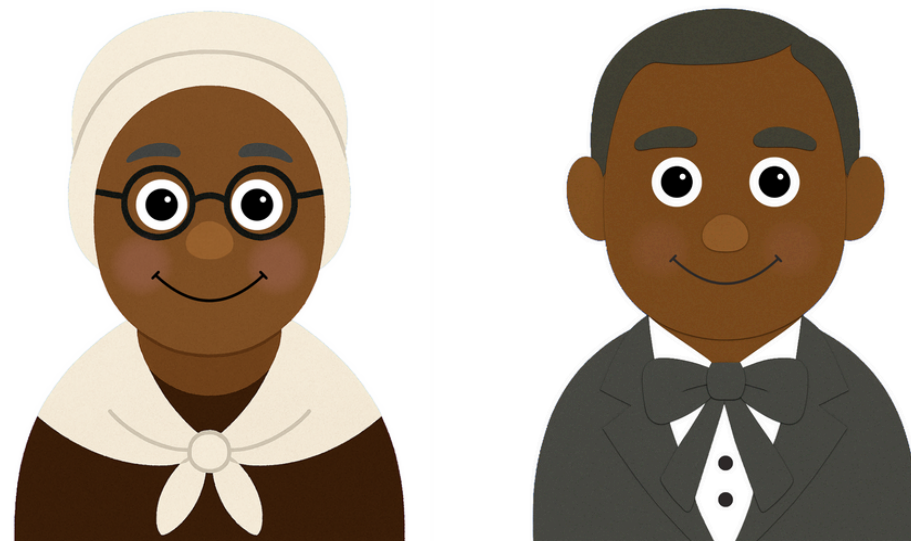

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

- Black History Month began in 1926 when historian Dr. Carter G. Woodson created "Negro History Week" to make sure Black history and achievements were taught and remembered. He chose February because it includes the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, two important figures in Black history.
- Over time, schools, communities, and organizations began celebrating for a full month, and in 1976, Black History Month was officially recognized in the United States.
- Today, Black History Month is a time to celebrate the contributions, culture, and achievements of Black Americans, while also recognizing their role in shaping our country's past, present, and future.
- When teaching about Black History Month to young students, focus on stories of courage, kindness, creativity, and leadership.

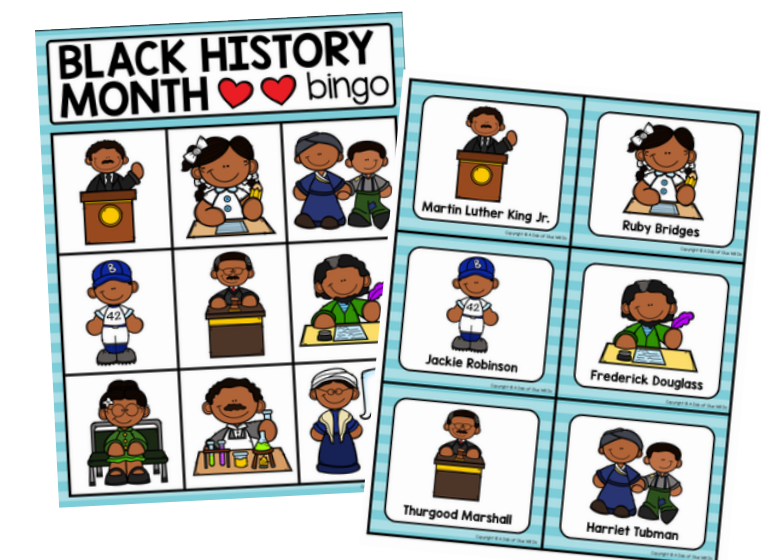
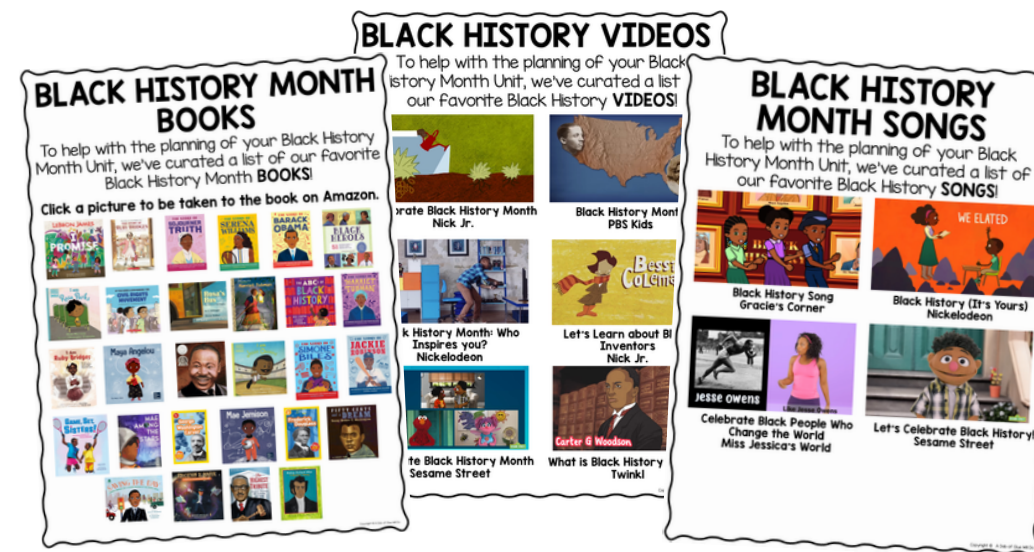
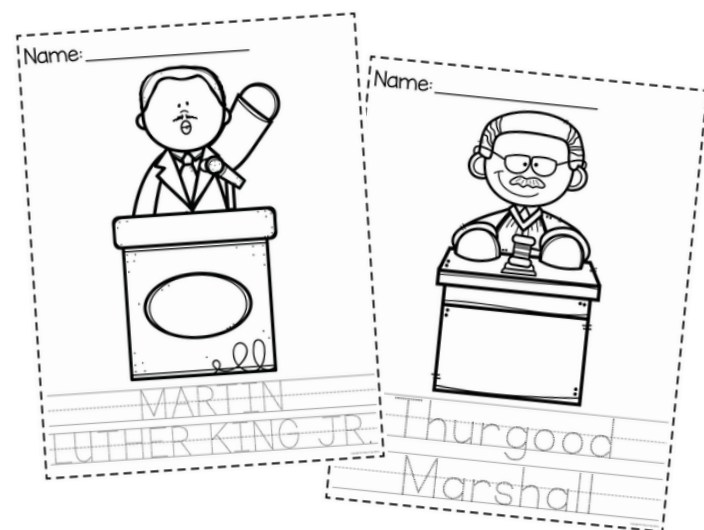
- Martin Luther King Jr. was a leader who worked to make sure everyone was treated fairly and with kindness. He believed in using peaceful words and actions to solve problems and bring people together. Dr. King helped lead the Civil Rights Movement, encouraging people to stand up for justice without hurting others.
