

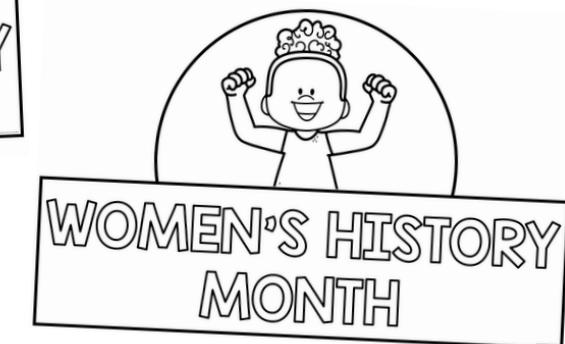

**WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH**

Women's History Month started as a local celebration for one week in California in 1978. The week of March 8th was selected to correspond with International Women's Day. The movement spread across the country the following year.

In 1980, a group of women's groups and historians lobbied for national recognition. In February 1980, President Jimmy Carter proclaimed the week of March 8, 1980, as National Women's History Week. In 1987, Congress passed a law that designated March as Women's History Month. Each year, the current President issues a proclamation designating the month of March as Women's History Month.

Women's History Month is a celebration of women's contributions to culture, history, and society. Women's contributions to US history are historically overlooked.

**ABIGAIL ADAMS**

Abigail Adams was the wife of President John Adams and an early advocate for women's rights. Through her letters she wrote to John Adams, she shared her thoughts on fairness, education, and the importance of women's voices. She believed women should be included in decisions that shaped the country. Her writing gives valuable insight into early American history.

**SOJOURNER TRUTH**

Sojourner Truth was born into slavery and later gained her freedom. She became a powerful speaker who traveled across the United States sharing messages about ending slavery and fighting for women's rights. She believed deeply in fairness and used her voice to stand up for people who were treated unfairly. Her courage and strength make her an important figure in both Black history and women's history.

**FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE**

Florence Nightingale was a nurse who worked to improve hospital conditions. She noticed that clean hospitals helped sick people heal better and worked to make hospitals safer. Florence is known as the founder of modern nursing, and her work paved the way for the importance of care, compassion, and education in helping others.

**CLARA BARTON**

Barton was a nurse who helped care for wounded soldiers during the American Civil War. She realized it was important to help people in times of need. She often brought medical supplies directly to the battlefield. Later, she founded the American Red Cross, an organization that still helps people during times of crisis and disasters today. Her work helped modern emergency care.
